This corner was established in October, 1853 by William T. Bradley. Original B.T.'s: elm, 11", S31°W, 11 links, and a maple, 10", S73°E, 10 links. In 1891, the Town Board of the town of Rolling, ordered that a road shall be laid out on the section line between Sections 17, 20, 18 & 19, and awarded damages for said road. I find no information of record other than this road information. In 1982, former surveyor Kelly called the corner: "Fence line intersection identified as corner location by occupation", and set an aluminum monument and marked three BT's. In 1997, we dug for evidence at the intersection of the center of Brookside Road, and the fenceline to the North. Found nothing. As Kelly's corner does not fit fences in Sections 18 and 19, nor the center of Brookside Road, I do not agree with his location for the corner. I accepted the intersection of a fence north and the center of a road to the south
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
