

U.S. PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD

(As Required By s. A-E 5.02, WI Adm. Code)

History of original corner establishment and subsequent restorations and description of any record, monument, occupational, testimonial or other evidence considered:

In 1857, A. Millard, Dep. Surveyor, set post and established 2 B.T.s; a Lynn 24" N.60°W. 6 lks. and a Hemlock 14" S.50°E. 8 lks.

No further record evidence was found;

In 1991, Mr. Virgil Ingram, a long-time local resident, showed me a 1½" iron pipe in an ancient fence corner with old fallen fences running N., E. & W. from corner location; found stump hole bearing N.60°W. 4' from I.P.

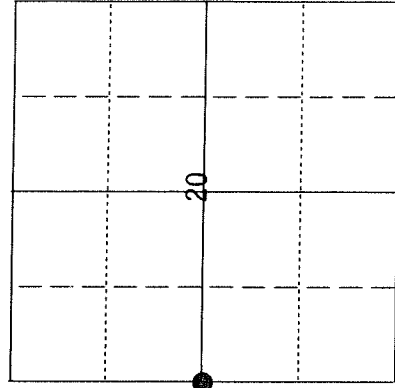

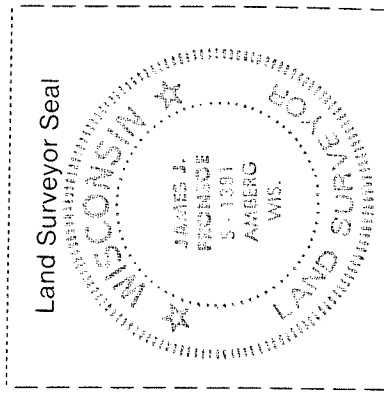
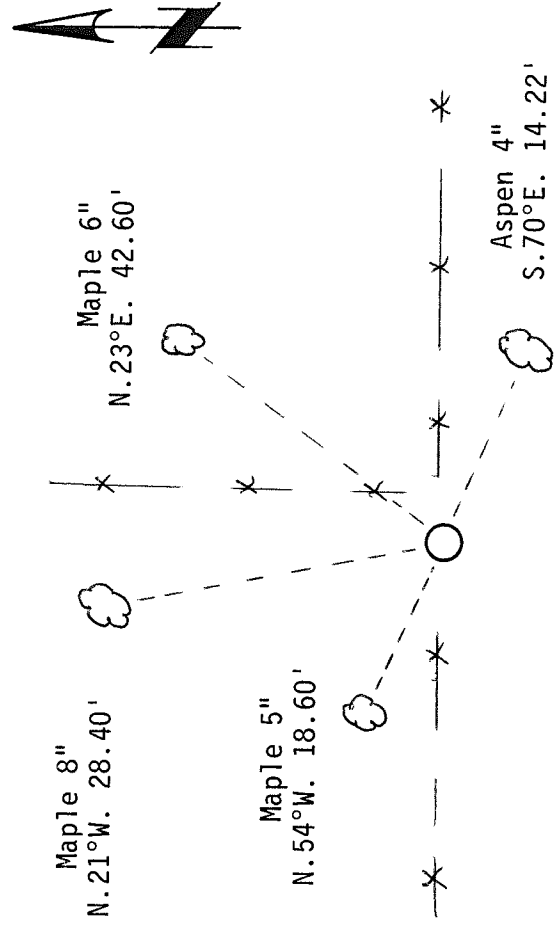
Describe the monument and accessories used to perpetuate the location of this corner. (include a plan view drawing and indicate what was set and/or found)

I accepted the location of the iron pipe as the best remaining evidence and replaced the pipe with a 2½" alum. post with cap and referenced with 20d spikes in blazed B.T.s as shown below.
