




(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

Original survey in 1865 by J.L. Nowlin. North between sections 33 and 34 at 40.00 chains, set wood post and made the following bearing trees: Hemlock, 30", N.32°E., 16½ links (10.89 feet), Sugar, 15", S.88°W., 17 links (11.22 feet).

In 1996, Alan Harrison, RLS, located the corner search area using G.P.S. control. No corner evidence was recovered. Reestablished the corner position at proportionate distance and on line between the Northwest and Southwest section corners of section 34. At the corner position set a 2½" X 36" aluminum monument with an aluminum cap stamped to identify corner. Blazed and scribed new bearing trees as noted below.




