
Describe record evidence, recovered physical evidence, occupational evidence, testimonia evidence and all other evidence considered in the recovery/restoration of the corner.

The original corner was established in 1865 by James Nowlin. Original bearing trees: hemlock, 12", N29°W, 5 lks., and a sugar, 10", N45°E, 12 lks. In 1937, Darwin Hintz found old fence corner and Dorr's BT: hemlock, 10", N85-3/4°E, 34.5 lks. (22.8'). He made new BT's: hemlock,10", N54-1/2°E, 48.5 lks. (32.0'), and a red oak, 4", S54°W, 16.5 lks. (10.9'). He set a monument common for that project, a 4" iron pipe with brass cap. In December 1976, former surveyor Kelly found the 4" iron pipe with brass cap set on 1937 resurvey, and found Dorr's 14" hemlock stump, N85°E, 22.94'. Kelly made new BT's: hemlock, 16", N54°E, 31.65'; a maple, 6", N40°30'W, 9.49'; and an oak, 9", S54°30'W, 10.65'. In June 1998, D. Tlusty, D.Willams found the 4" iron pipe with brass cap, in good condition; a blue painted line north and south and a line brushed open to the west to the road. Found Dorr's hemlock stump, destroyed at S85°E, 22.7'. Also found the two 1937 BT's. Accepted the found monument as the best evidence of the original corner location.

For the corner, I left the existing monument in place. Set white vinyl sign post 1.2' north of the monument.


