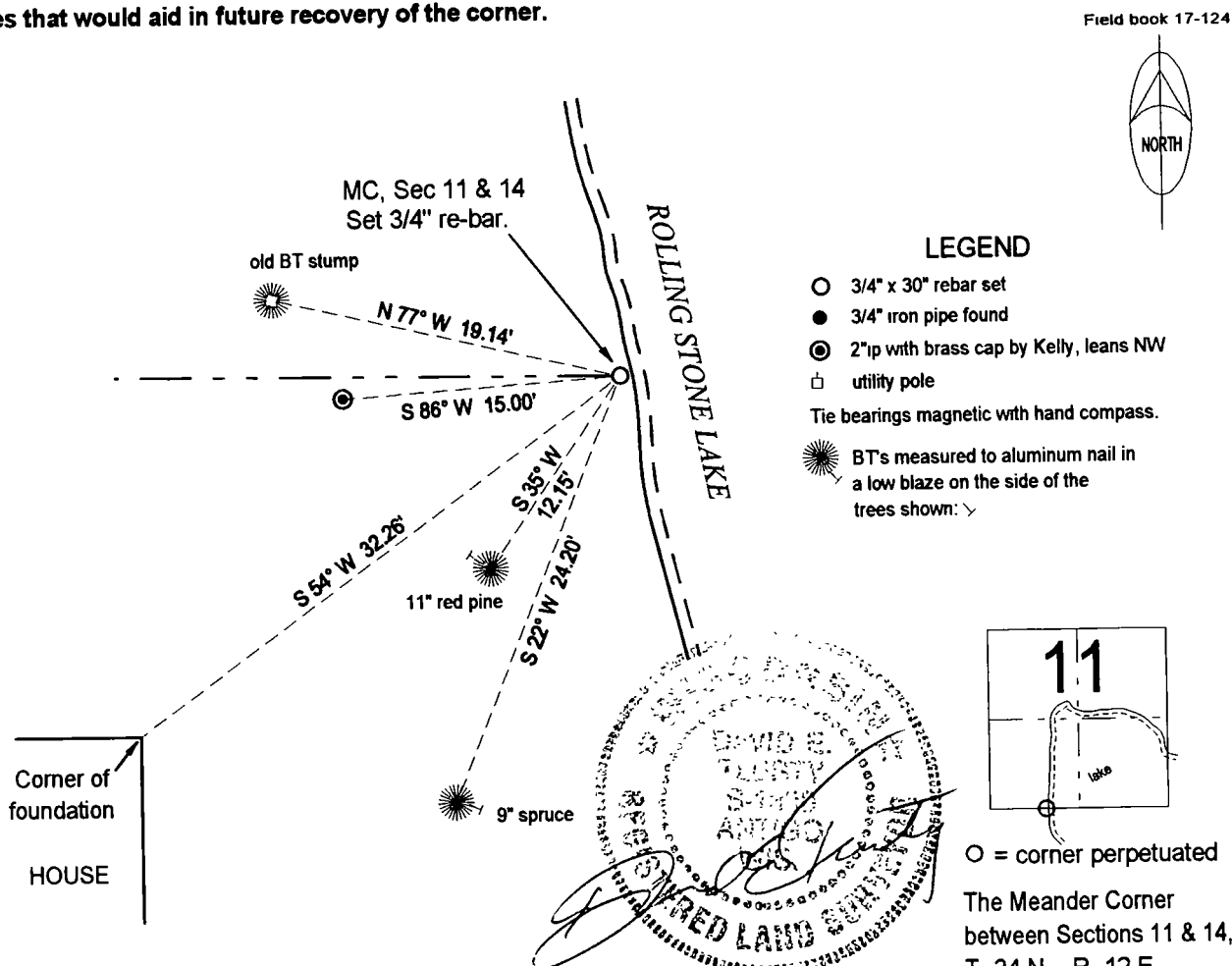
Describe record evidence, recovered physical evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence and all other evidence considered in the recovery/restoration of the corner.

The original corner was established in 1865 by James L. Nowlin. Original bearing trees: hemlock, 20", S20°W, 6 links and a hemlock, 10", N40°W, 12 links. In 1909, Brooks said "orig BT's all gone but one rotten stump, new poplar, 9", N81°W, 29 & stone in place with + and marked BT is N72°W, 0.07." In April, 1975, former surveyor Kelly "located 2" iron pipe identified by resident witness as the meander cor. Set 2" ip w brass cap & ties." In 2001, I found Kellys IP and noted that the distance from his pipe to the section corner west was approximately 30' short of original gov't. dist. Further searched revealed the 1909 poplar BT @ about N40°W, 6' from Kellys IP. The poplar stump is mostly rotted away except for the harder wood around the blaze heal mark facing the lake. Brooks' bearing and distance from this stump falls in the rock outcropping at the shoreline which would be in harmony with Brooks statement that he marked a stone only 0.07 ch (4.6') from the corner. I accept the poplar BT stump as the best remaining evidence of the original corner location and measured Brooks distance on a corrected bearing to set a 3/4" rebar at the original meander corner location.

Physical description of the monument set:

I set a 3/4" x 30" rebar for the corner.

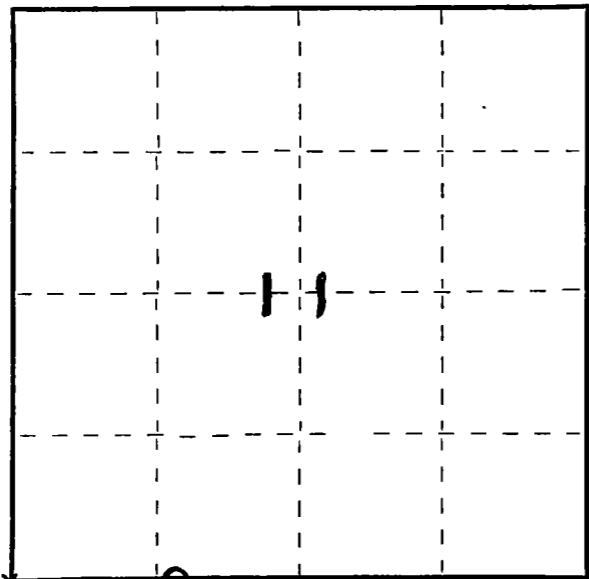

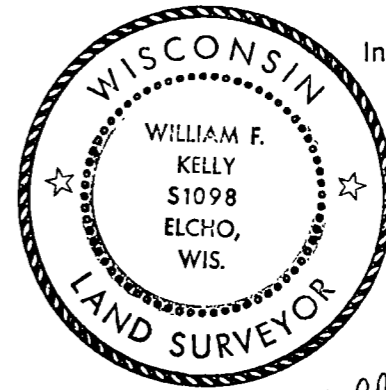

Bore hole 1967 found 1720 ft. below surface

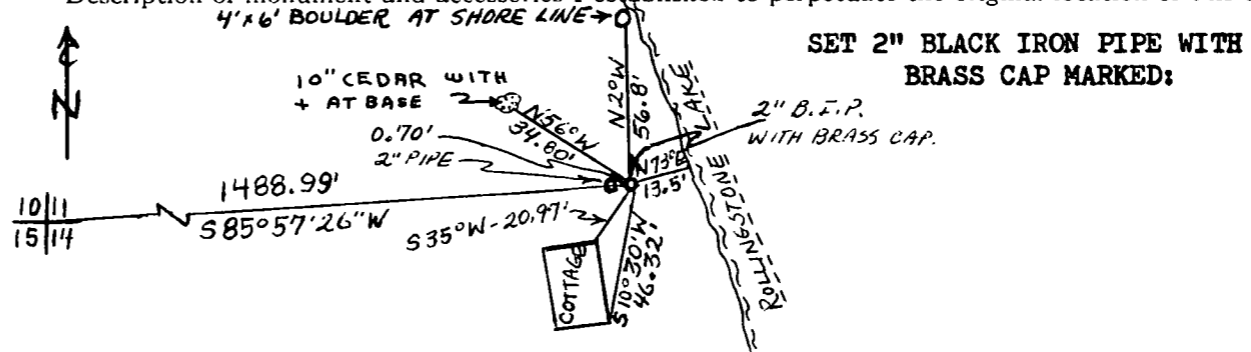
